

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Activities of the United Nations Population Fund

The [United Nations Population Fund \(UNFPA\)](#) was previously known as the [United Nations Fund for Population Activities](#).

It further discusses the role of the United States in supporting UNFPA programs, the varying interpretations by several Administrations of legislative authorities pertaining to UNFPA's eligibility for American resources, and congressional debates over how much and under what conditions the United States should voluntarily contribute to UNFPA operations. Finally, it reviews the findings of several private and U.S. government investigations of China's family planning programs and the role UNFPA plays in their implementation. - (3) **UNFPA is a Tool of the Rich White Nations**: Almost all of the UNFPA's funding comes from rich White nations (Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, United Kingdom, Japan, Denmark, Germany, Finland, Canada and Switzerland), all of which are declining in

population (except for Canada). These nations need a huge amount of natural resources from the developing nations, and the UNFPA insures that the populations of these developing nations will be smaller so that the donor nations can continue to have access to the world's natural resources. - (4) **UNFPA Intends to Destroy the Family**: UNFPA leaders have said that the breakup of the family is a "triumph of human rights over patriarchy" and should be encouraged. Nowhere is the destructive attitude of UNFPA plainer. To see an article with more detail, click [here](#).
- (5) **Abortion for Ten-Year-Old Girls**: Through its youth initiative Y-PEER, UNFPA demands all reproductive health services for children beginning at the age of 10, including contraception, sterilization and abortion. Also, it signed the "Joint Youth Statement on the Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights of Young People," which demands the total legalization of drug use and prostitution. - (6) **Support of Sodomy**: Although it claims to want to lessen the transmission of HIV/AIDS, UNFPA wholeheartedly supports the very activity that spreads it the fastest: Sodomy, or what UNFPA calls it, "anal sex." - (7) **The UNFPA Simply Adores Abortion**: Vietnam has the highest abortion rate in the world and is struggling with a hugely out-of-

- (8) **Support of Transgenderism:** UNFPA signed a September 2015 resolution entitled "[Ending Violence and Discrimination against Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Intersex People.](#)" This resolution, which was signed by most of the major organs of the United Nations, is a formal, full-on endorsement of all aspects of the homosexual special rights agenda. It makes the false claim that millions of homosexuals and other "sexual minorities" face grave threats against their most basic human rights, and asserts that failure to uphold their rights "constitute[s] serious violations of international human rights law." The document calls for enhanced prosecution of people who commit hate crimes against LGBTI individuals and condemns what it calls "unethical and harmful so-called "therapies" to change sexual orientation." The document also demands special rights for transgendered people and "education" of others about their special needs and says that LGBTI people should help draft laws that concern them. Most of this sounds very reasonable, but in places where such policies have been enacted, immediate repression of "homophobes" immediately begins, to include systematic violation of the rights of those who oppose the homosexual agenda. - (12) **Sex Education:** UNFPA was listed as a participant in the updating of the Second Edition of UNESCO's [International Technical Guidance on Sexuality Education: An Evidence-Informed Approach for Schools, Teachers and Health Educators](#) in 2018 in support of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Major contributors to the First and Second Editions of the [International Technical Guidance](#) included some of the worst population suppression organizations on Earth, including the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), the Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA), SIECUS and the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), which has been deeply involved in the Chinese forced abortion program for decades. The result, of course, could not be anything but an "everything goes" approach that is entirely bereft of moral guidance. Apparently, "evidence-informed" means to studiously ignore any evidence that contradicts the writers of this *Guidance*, since not one pro-life or pro-family person or organization was consulted. This *Guidance* recommends that sex education begin at the age of five, and that it feature all of the elements of explicit sex education, including the use of abortion and all methods of contraception, and the acceptance of all sexual practices, no matter how harmful or bizarre. - (13) **Global Climate Change Alarmism**: The United Nations Population Fund is listed as a "[Resource](#)" on "[The Population Bomb](#)" Web site. This Web site is named after perhaps the worst example of pseudo-"research" ever peddled by extremist Leftists — Paul Ehrlich's awful 1968 book *The Population Bomb*. It tries to make its case by showing a sardine can packed with people. Apparently, in spite of all of the evidence that shows that the world's population is rapidly leveling off, and despite the fact that almost all of the "facts" in the original *Population Bomb* book were proven absolutely false, some organizations are willing to continue to justify their own lavish budgets by peddling this outdated alarmist nonsense.¹
- (14) **Undermining Religion**: The United Nations Population Fund has worked closely with anti-religious groups such as 'Catholics' for a Free Choice in order to [undermine the teachings of the Catholic Church](#) and thus dilute its influence in target nations. - (15) **UNFPA Corruption**: The United Nations has a free ride with mandatory donations from many developed nations. Therefore, it feels that it has little accountability to these donors. A 2012 report found that UNFPA had five billion dollars surplus cash and could not account for hundreds of millions of dollars of it. The UNFPA refused to answer questions after failing this audit and, despite claiming that it is dedicated to "transparency," refused to

- (16) UNFPA's affiliates in Argentina, Malawi, Pakistan, Tanzania, Yemen and Zimbabwe are all member organizations of the [White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood \(WRASM\)](#), which is just another one of many pro-abortion organizations which begin its deceptions with its very name, because its primary objective is not to promote "safe motherhood" at all. Instead, it claims that, by reducing "unsafe abortion" (i.e., by legalizing abortion) worldwide, less women will die. WRASM's primary members are leading population suppression organizations, including Family Care International (FCI), the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), IPAS, JHPIEGO, the John Snow Research and Training Institute, Pathfinder International, Program for Appropriate Technology in Health (PATH), and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). Its organizational membership proudly lists thousands of names. BUT — this list leans heavily on the common and dishonest progressive "pufferfish tactic," listing hundreds of such titans of activism and philosophy as "Binky Bear Toys," "LolliDoo Diapers," "Maternity Tuggs Comfortable Maternity Suspenders," the "Pikanini Baby Academy," and "Yoga for the Empowered Goddess." - (17) UNFPA is listed as a "collaborating and supporting organization" in the 2007 edition of [Family Planning: A Global Handbook for Providers](#), which was written by the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF); the International Confederation of Midwives (ICM); the International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics (FIGO); the International Council of Nurses (ICN); the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA); the United States Agency for International Development (USAID); the United Nations World Health Organization (UNWHO); and the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. This publication is used all over the developing world and gives details on every kind of abortifacient and contraceptive form of birth control. - (18) The United Nations Population Fund assisted in the development and publication of [Safe Motherhood: A Review](#), a 100-page history and summary of the Safe Motherhood Initiative from 1987 to 2005. One of the primary goals of this 2007 publication was to eliminate "unsafe abortion" simply by legalizing the procedure worldwide. *Safe Motherhood* says that this could be done by emphasizing the contribution to maternal mortality of illegal abortion (while never explaining how legalizing the procedure would allegedly decrease maternal mortality), decriminalizing abortion and then legalizing it worldwide, and increasing access to "family planning." The document also recommends "Increased advocacy for all sexual and reproductive health issues, including increasing women's access to safe abortion services (where not against the

law) and the health consequences of unsafe abortion." It also noted approvingly that, in some developing nations, registered nurse-midwives are trained to use manual vacuum aspiration (MVA) machines "for incomplete abortion and provide postabortion care." As every population controller knows, MVA machines are used to perform huge numbers of illegal abortions in developing nations and also desensitizes their people to the widespread availability of the procedure. Finally, one of its "Ten Action Messages for Safe Motherhood" calls for the wide availability of abortion. In other words, this 'safe motherhood' document is just another push for universal population suppression. Using the same pro-abortion jargon we are all so tired of hearing, the document condemns a "small, vocal minority of delegations from conservative member states" that refuse to "make reproductive health services available on a universal basis." The term "reproductive health services," of course, includes unlimited abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy at taxpayer expense. "Safe Motherhood" also pushes for abortion being classified as a "human right," and inevitably demands lots and lots of cash to fund its projects and pay its leader's bloated salaries, which, in the end, is all it is about. - (19) The United Nations Population Fund endorsed the 2009 Women Deliver document entitled "[Focus on 5: Women's Health and the MDGs](#)." The groups that signed this document form a conglomeration of the most notorious population suppression groups in the world. The document alleges that its overall goal is to reduce maternal mortality, but by now everyone knows that the *real* objective is to legalize abortion worldwide, even though "unsafe

abortions" are the cause of a relatively small percentage of maternal deaths in developing nations. Sure enough, the terms "reproductive health" and "reproductive rights" appear more than two dozen times in this short publication, showing where the emphasis of these population suppression groups really is. They say "We know what it will take to significantly improve maternal, newborn, and reproductive health: 1. Access to family planning — counselling, services, supplies; ... 3. Access to safe abortion services, when legal (as per paragraph 8.25 of the Programme of Action for ICPD)." Pro-lifers would agree with the document's statement that "Maternal health is a human right," but it is clear that here, the term is interpreted to include abortion, sterilization and contraception. As always with such documents, the Culture of Death demands billions of dollars to fund its anti-life activism. The document complains that MDG 5 is not being properly funded, and demands an increase over the already-huge worldwide annual investment in "maternal health" by at least \$20 billion a year. Since this document so heavily stresses "reproductive rights," we can be sure that this extra money would mostly go not to actual maternal health care, but to agitating for the legalization and implementation of worldwide free abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. - (20) The United Nations Population Fund is a donor to the [African Population and Health Research Center \(APHRC\)](#), which is nothing more than one of many front groups for the population suppression cartel, which itself is a façade created by rich Western nations. Western nations (and their foundations) pour money into groups

like APHRC, pay their leaders vast sums of money, and then these smaller groups present themselves as Africans who are only concerned about the welfare of their fellow Africans. The APHRC is located in Nairobi, Kenya, and one of its primary purposes is to convince the governments of sub-Saharan Africa that abortion must be legalized all over the continent. At least playing the role of a puppet of the West's population suppression cartel pays very well! - (22) The United Nations Population Fund made a large commitment to advance "family planning" (population control) around the world at the [December 2013 London Summit on Family Planning](#), which was

co-sponsored by UKAID (the United Kingdom Agency for International Development) and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Representatives of governments, United Nations agencies, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) combined forces to pledge billions of dollars towards an unprecedented push towards flooding the developing world with every kind of abortifacient and contraception. The London Summit professed not to promote abortion, but since many of its donor NGOs and UN agencies are major population control groups, this seems a hollow promise at best. As usual, the 'contraceptive imperialists' targeted Africa — 17 of 23 nations who sent high-ranking members of their governments to the London Summit were from Africa. This conference was organized and conducted by the RAISE [Reproductive Health Access, Information and Services in Emergencies] Initiative and the Reproductive Health Response in Conflict (RHRC) Consortium. The Conference addressed "reproductive health" matters in more than thirty developing nations, including Afghanistan, Angola,

Bangladesh, the Central African Republic, Chad, Colombia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Gaza/West Bank, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Kenya, Liberia, Myanmar, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, the Philippines, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Tanzania, Thailand, Timor-Leste, Uganda and Zimbabwe. The purpose of the conference generally was to ensure that these population control groups pushed abortion as an essential component of aid in disaster situations. - (26) The United Nations Population Fund is a core donor and a member of the Ethiopian National Steering Committee of the statement "[Family Planning and the Post-2015 Development Framework: Achieving Universal Access to Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights](#)," which was adopted at the International Conference on Family Planning, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia on November 12-15, 2013. This 'Statement' demands that the planning framework in the era following the United Nations Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) include the worldwide promotion of sexual and reproductive health (SRH), which includes free abortion, sterilization and contraception. The 'Statement' alleges, without support, that "Family planning is a fundamental right," and claims that its universal adoption will prevent 20 million abortions annually, a figure that has been widely discredited. Its five Federations, one on each continent, bring in celebrities and experts to conduct glittery and well-publicized conferences to advance these ends. - (31) Targeting Youth: UNFPA is one of the primary funders of the Ottawa, Canada-based Youth Coalition for Sexual and Reproductive Rights (YCSRR), which is one of several front groups that are actually founded and operated by adults. These adults train selected youths and control them carefully, and any attempts by the youth to stray "off message" are quickly squashed. YCSRR attempts to give the appearance of a spontaneous organization put together by youth. Its purpose is to infiltrate various anti-life ideas, especially regarding population control, homosexuality and abortion, into the minds of young people of developing nations. - (36) Aminata Toure, Technical Advisor on Gender for the United Nations Population Fund, signed the Chiang Mai Declaration on March 3, 2004. Sponsored by the International Committee for the Peace Council, a group of leading pro-abortion "religious" women met in Chiang Mai, Thailand, to discuss worldwide abortion legalization strategy. Since such people cannot go to the bathroom without drawing up an inflated list of demands or some bloviated manifesto, they wrote the so-called "Chiang Mai Declaration," subtitled "[Religion and Women: An Agenda for Change](#)." Most of these women are in some way connected to religion, and so they naturally wrote that the basic tenets of all religion support "reproductive rights" without, of course, producing any evidence of this allegation. The statement alleges that homosexuals should have the same rights as everyone else (including marriage), and

that abortion must be legalized everywhere in the world. The statement says that "the view of any particular religious tradition should not be imposed on the consciences of others. Decriminalization of abortion is a minimal response to this reality and a reasonable means of protecting the life and health of women at risk" (the same unsupportable nonsense that pro-abortionists use to try to blunt pro-life fervor in Europe and the United States). The key to the entire statement is the belief that "Unless we work to change men, the ability of religions to progress in sensitivity to women is impossible."
